
Certified Cervical & Temporomandibular Therapist (CCTT) - CEU Policy – Category 2 Criteria

Certified CCTTs maintaining active certification for each biennial reporting period.

CEU requirements ensure that professionals:

- Stay current in **Craniofacial and Cervical Therapeutics**.
- Enhance clinical skills and professional judgment.
- Maintain competence beyond entry-level practice standards.

Category 2: Criteria for the 30 CEUs (Biennial Renewal Requirement)

Purpose:

Required for all CCTTs to maintain active status.

Timeframe:

- **30 CEUs** required every **2-year reporting period** (January 1-December 31st at 8p EST).
 - If a course ends after the January 1 deadline, this course will only count to the next biennial renewal period.
 - NOTE: April 15, 2026-December 31, 2027 is an exception due to policy changes. The courses from Jan-April of 2026 counted in the previous biennial and cannot be counted twice.
- Odd-year certifications: **15 CEUs** required for the first biennial period.
 - Newly certified CCTTs during an even year (2026, 2028, 2030, 2032, 2034 etc.) must complete 30 CEUs for their first biennial CEU reporting period.
 - Your exam and preparation count as 15 CEUs for the first year
 - Your second year requires you to acquire 15 CEUs and submit
 - If you attend the AAOP/PTBCCT meeting and attend a minimum of 15 hours, your full 30 CEUs will have been satisfied.
 - Newly certified CCTTs in an odd year (, 2027, 2029, 2031, 2033 etc.)

- Your exam counts as your 15 required CEUs for the submission the following year.

Instructor Requirements For Continuing Education Courses:

- All instructors must be healthcare professionals with a **4-year degree** from an accredited university.

Topic Requirements:

- **Category 2A: CEU course, conference, home studies, etc. (NOT webinars)**
 - CEUs are based on contact hours. Contact hours are defined as the number of actual clock hours spent in direct participation in a structured education format as a learner. 1 CEU or .1 CEU is equivalent to 1 contact hour (50-60 minutes).
- **Minimum 15 CEUs** of the 30 CEUs must be in specialty-specific topics. Course content specific to our specialty includes,
 - Temporomandibular Disorders
 - Cervical Spine Disorders
 - Cervicothoracic Spine Disorders
 - Headache Disorders.
 - Orofacial Pain Disorders
 - Facial paralysis Disorders
 - Vocal Disorders
 - Swallow Disorders
 - Vestibular Disorders
 - Concussion Disorders
 - Breathing Disorders
 - Sleep Disorders
 - Ear, Nose, and Throat Disorders
 - Oral Myofunctional / Oral Cavity Disorders
 - Occlusal Disorders
 - Oral Appliance Therapy
 - Cancer of the Head/Neck
 - Head, Neck, TMJ, Nasopharyngeal, and Throat Anatomy
 - Body / Mind Stress Reduction Therapy for the purpose of de-sensitization of pain related to head, neck and orofacial areas.

- Medication for the management of pain and biopsychosocial issues (anxiety and depression)
- *All pre-conference and main conference lectures that were attended at the AAOP Scientific Conference.* (Certificate of Attendance is only required)
 - The system will require a syllabus submission (please upload the certificate twice to satisfy the renewal requirement from the website perspective)
- The instructor(s) of all courses must be a healthcare professional that has a 4-year degree from an accredited university
- Each course submitted for approval must be accompanied by a Certificate of Attendance or a Certificate of Completion. The certificate must include the following:
 - Participants name
 - Course name
 - Course date
 - Course sponsor
 - Total number of CEUs
- Without a Certificate of Attendance, all CEUs will be denied.
- Each course submitted must be accompanied by course syllabus, course description and/or course handouts.
 - The section of the syllabus that applies to the CEUs claimed must be highlighted and/or delineated before uploading.
- If documentation is not provided, the course and CEUs will be denied.

Should 30 CEUs not be achieved in 2A, additional CEUs can be achieved in 2B, 2C and/or 2D

Additional CEUs (max of 15 CEUs) can be earned through 2B, 2C, and 2D:

- The content of possible activities listed below **must be** related to topics identified in 2A.
- **Professional Development (Category 2B):**
 - Speaking at conferences
 - Publishing articles, textbooks, or multimedia
 - Teaching new CEU courses
 - Serving as a panelist or exam item writer

- All possible activities must be done during the reporting period to receive CEU credit. The exceptions are publications whose writing began before the reporting period but must be published within the reporting period.

Possible Activities	Number of CEUs	Required Documentation
Speaker at a conference or study club attended by healthcare professionals	15 CEUs per lecture. Lecture to be no less than 45 minutes	Letter of acknowledgement from the conference coordinator or chairperson of the study club (date of presentation must be included in the letter). Course syllabus and objectives.
Speaker at a conference or study club attended by non-healthcare professionals	10 CEUs per lecture. Lecture to be no less than 45 minutes	Letter of acknowledgement from the conference coordinator or chairperson of study club (date of presentation must be included in the letter). Course syllabus and learning objectives.
Panelist at a conference attended by healthcare professionals	1 CEU per topic for a max of 3 topics	Letter of acknowledgement from the conference coordinator (date and title of presentation must be included in the letter)
Created and taught for the first time a course presented in person or online to healthcare professionals. The course must offer CEUs to the participants.	>3-8 hour course - 5 CEUs 9 - 15 hour course - 10 CEUs >16 hour course - 15 CEUs	Course objectives, course syllabus, course outline to include timetable and topics covered, course certificate provided to participants and bio of the instructor. If the course was presented in a state that requires CEU approval, a letter from the state's physical therapy association showing that the course was approved for CEUs. The same course cannot be used for future reporting periods.
Author of an article in a peer reviewed journal	Primary = 15 CEUs per article Secondary = 10 CEUs per article	Guidelines for authors and copy of article

Author of an abstract in a peer reviewed journal	Primary = 5 CEUs per abstract Secondary = 5 CEUs per abstract	Guidelines for authors and copy of abstract
Author of a published textbook	Primary = 15 CEUs per book Secondary = 10 CEUs per book	Copy of title page, including the publication date
Primary author of a chapter in a published textbook	15 CEUs per book	Copy of title page, including the publication date and table of contents or list of contributors
Author of a poster presentation at a conference– peer reviewed or refereed	Primary = 10 CEUs per presentation Secondary = 5 CEUs per presentation	Letter of acknowledgement from the conference coordinator. Title of poster presentation.
Primary author of published multimedia material (CD-ROM, audio or video)	15 CEUs per publication	Copy of publication and copy of multimedia CD, CDROM or DVD, etc.
Primary author of a home study course	5 CEUs	Copy of syllabus and learning objectives
Primary author of a Pilot Study published in a peer reviewed journal	10 CEUs	Guidelines for authors and copy of article
Primary author of a Guest editorial published in a peer reviewed journal	10 CEUs	Guidelines for authors and copy of article
Exam item writer	5 CEUs per year of active item writing	Letter of acknowledgment from exam company

- **Post-Certification College/University Coursework (Category 2C):**

- The content of possible activities listed below must be related to topics identified in 2A.
- The college/university attended must be accredited by an agency recognized by the US Department of Education.
- In order to be eligible, a course must be assigned credit hours and listed on an official transcript.
- In order for practicum courses, clinical and internship experiences to be eligible, credit hours must be earned and listed as such on an official transcript.
- 1 classroom hour of lecture or lab = 1 CEU, submit course syllabus indicating how many hours course met per semester.
- Teaching a college course is acceptable for CE credit. 1 classroom hour of lecture or lab = 1 CEU, if you can show this is the first time you have taught the course or if the course is updated since it was previously offered, proper documentation is required. The course must be relevant to topics as identified in 2A.
- Non-credit college courses are not acceptable for CE credit.

College/university official course	1 CEU=1 hour of classroom time, as pertains to college/university	Official transcript from accredited college/university
Residency as defined by the PTBCCT domain, must pertain to Cervical Spine, TMD, OFP, Headaches, Oral surgery, neuropathic pain, sleep disorders, biopsychosocial issues and related dental/medical pathology)	15 CEUs per year as determined by residency program	Official transcript from accredited college/university or letter from residency program coordinator

● **1 Hour Webinars & 1 Hour Courses (Category 2D):**

- A maximum of 15 CEUs can be achieved in this category
- The content of possible activities listed below must be related to topics identified in 2A.
- The PTBCCT recognizes that webinars provide valuable educational opportunities and play an important role in the ongoing professional development of clinicians. Webinars and 1 hour courses offer convenient access to current evidence, expert perspectives, and emerging topics within Craniofacial and Cervical Therapeutics.
- However, to encourage the development of advanced clinical competence and the integration of knowledge into patient care, a maximum of 15 CEUs may be earned through webinar-based education during each reporting period. Longer-format educational experiences, including in-person courses, extended online coursework, conferences, and structured training programs, provide greater opportunities for comprehensive instruction, skill development, critical thinking, discussion, and application of concepts.
- The PTBCCT believes that a balanced approach to continuing education best supports clinician growth. Limiting webinar-based and 1 hour courses CEUs encourages certificants to engage in more in-depth learning experiences that foster advanced clinical reasoning, hands-on skill acquisition, and mastery of complex concepts relevant to cervical, temporomandibular, orofacial disorders, and airway disorders.
- Accordingly, no more than 15 CEUs may be applied toward certification renewal through Category 2D 1 hour webinar/1 hour activities.

Possible Activities	Number of CEUs	Required Documentation
Webinars/Courses	1 CEU hour= 45-60 min (includes the Q&A time)	Documentation that you attended the webinar (certificate of completion) and the learning objectives for the webinar/course.

Instructor Requirements:

- Observed or taught by a healthcare professional with a **4-year degree** from an accredited university.

Documentation Required:

- Certificate + supporting learning objectives.

- All CEUs must be approved by the PTBCCT Application Review/CEU Committee.
 - Improper or missing documentation will result in denial until revisions are made.
